SENIORS: Important reminders as we approach the end of the school year:

- Students should continue checking emails regularly. This is where colleges will send useful information like upcoming orientations, placement testing requirements, scheduling days, housing information, etc.
 - Families should review and accept financial aid packages. If there is an error, students can contact the financial aid office. Families can also meet with the financial aid office at the college to review information if there are questions or changes.
 - Scholarships are consistently being posted and updated through emails to students as well as on the students' Naviance accounts. Many applications are due at the end of May.
 - Once final decisions are made, please remember to let other colleges know that you will not be attending either through email or the postcard that comes with acceptance packages.
 - Students having taken courses through OCC or Le Moyne College should send an official transcript to the college they are attending in the Fall of 2022.
 - AP scores should be sent to the student's college of attendance, by students, through collegeboard.org. Many colleges will have listed on their websites what scores are accepted for college credit.
 - Students who have not sent official scores for the SAT and ACT (for those colleges it is required for) should also send those to the college which they are attending through the following websites: collegeboard.org or act.org
- Students have received a Final Transcript Request/Future Plan form from the counselors at the end of April due May 20th. Transcripts are sent at the end of June once all grades are finalized.

Prom/Gala information:

Guests and/or dates from other schools or outside of Bishop Ludden are allowed this year. Proper paperwork should be completed and handed in by May 1.

BL Science Olympiad Team B scores top 20 in four events

The Bishop Ludden Science Olympiad team last month scored four top 20 finishes at the Science Olympiad B State Tournament at East Syracuse- Minoa High School. Bishop Ludden last traveled to the tournament in 2011. Forty of the best teams in the entire state, including NYC and Long Island, sent the top 1% of players to States.

Momin Naveed and his teammate Aidan Colangelo had the team's highest results with 14th in **Mission Possible**. Captains Meghan Snyder and Anthony Taylor finished 18th in **Storm the Castle**, while improving from 10th place in **Disease Detectives** at Regionals to 22nd in the entire state after working with former coach and physician Dr. Linda Mandanas. Anthony also paired with Olivia Smith for 18th in **Write It Do It**. Olivia paired with Payton Campbell for 19th in **Ping Pong Parachute** (they scored the team's lone set of golds in this event at Regionals.) Other team members included Aidan Grealish-Liquori, Hayden Parkhurst, Gabriella Berry, and Sophia Azria. The team was coached by Maxine Babcock and Grace Babcock, with student assistant coaches Ryan Skanes, Isaiah Apps, Julia Smith, Peter Smith, and Zander Craner. Eight of the 10 players will be returning to B Regional Action in 2022-23 while Aidan Grealish Liquori and Hayden Parkhurst will head up to the varsity squad.

BL hosts Syracuse Elementary, Middle School Bees

Bishop Ludden last month hosted the Syracuse Regional Site for International Academic Competitions with the Regional Finals for Elementary and Middle School History Bee, Science Bee, and Geography Bee. Students from all over the state took the Online Regional Qualifying Exams (ORQEs). High-ranking students qualified for the Regional Finals. IAC's Scott Blish and Bishop Ludden Coach Maxine Babcock ran the all day tournament. Winners at Regionals qualified for Nationals this summer.

Bishop Ludden eighth-graders Momin Naveed, Gabriella Berry, and Parker Brown finished 1-2-3 at the Eighth Grade Science Bee. Momin also finished second in the History and Geography bees. All three qualified for nationals in June. Bishop Ludden seventh-grader Sophia took the silver medal in History, while Shane Richard finished second in Science.

Most Holy Rosary had a fantastic finish. Jayden Sheard took silver in Science, followed by Kevin Smith with Bronze. Stephan Zubrzycki scored Silver in the Sixth Grade History Bee, while William Gannon scored Brone. Akuch Choi received the Gold in the Fifth Grade History Bee. The Geography Bee saw Stephan repeating with Silver, followed by Brendan Smith in the Sixth Grade competition.

Bishop Ludden will repeat as the 2022-23 host next year and will also be the Regional Site for the 2022-23 High School History Bowl and Bee.

BL takes on Small School National Championship Tournament (Open Division) and Junior Varsity History Bowl Nationals

Bishop Ludden's Quiz Bowl team was the only New York private school to qualify for NAQT's Small School National Championship Tournament in the Open Division for three straight years. The team had their 2020 trip to Chicago canceled at the last minute due to Covid, then took seventh place in the country 2021's online nationals. Eight seniors graduated from the team and the cycle started again in the 2021-22 season. Bishop Ludden qualified two teams at the Ithaca tournament in the fall of 2021. A month later, the JV team qualified for both the Varsity and Junior Varsity History Bowl Nationals with their outstanding performance at the Buffalo Regionals. Sophomore Peter Smith and seventh grader Sophia Azria qualified for both SSNCT (near Chicago) and JVHBN (near Washington, DC) tournaments, then had to choose, because they were at exactly the same time. Peter chose SSNCT, while Sophia picked History Bowl.

"We were shocked, in a good way," said Coach Maxine Babcock. "We never expected to qualify for either tournament because we were in a rebuilding year. That set us on a course of trying to raise enough money to go. I couldn't be in two places, so the moms took over handling the History Bowl details. I'm very proud of those three players. Many thanks to our wonderful parents and grandparents who stepped up to coach and chaperone at the History Bowl."

Bishop Ludden competes in the much more difficult Open Division in SSNCT. This encompasses many of the finest magnet and private schools in the world. Because of Covid, there have been very few live qualifying events, so the squad has stayed fresh by competing in Texas Quiz Bowl Alliance events online.

Juniors Jon Daher and Brigid Hardick joined sophomores Zander Craner, Julia Smith, Peter Smith, and Ryan Skanes on the trip to Chicago. The six players had never played together and only Jon had experience in the timed format for SSNCT. The experienced squad opened with a 120-110 buzzer beater against Young Women's Leadership A, then lost to Toledo Arts and St. Margaret's Episcopal in blowouts. The team had a competitive first half against Treasure Valley and Green Farms, then suffered another smackdown by Elgin Academy. The team rebounded to lose to TAG Magnet by a one question turnaround. Friends Select scored a blowout, then the team nipped Providence B 140-135 at the buzzer to notch a second win. The team lost to Holy Spirit in the final game of Preliminary Rounds. Peter was the 66th out of 271 players, averaging 28.14 points per 20 tossups heard. Brigid, who captained the team, has only played in one live tournament before nationals,



averaged 13.98, Zander averaged 8.62, and Jon 1.46. Everyone played and scored, and all players contributed to the team portion of scoring.

Parents Dr. Daniel Smith, Sandra Craner, Michelle Smith, and Cheryl Hardick accompanied the team to numerous cultural spots, including Soldier Field, Chicago's Art Institute, Millennium Park, Gino's for deep dish pizza The Five Roses for Irish Fish and Chips, and The Field Museum of Natural History.

Another highlight of the trip was provided by Providence Academy. Coach Dr. Kevin Keiser recruited Father David Mowry, instructor in the Department of Biblical Studies and Homiletics at the University of St. Mary of the Lake/Mundelein Seminary, to provide Saturday evening Mass for the teams. Father Mowry's enthusiastic sermon in the Vienna Room at the Hyatt Regency O'Hare is likely to spark an ongoing tradition.

Meanwhile, seventh-grader Sophia Azria, eighth-grader Gabriella Berry, and freshman Aidan Grealish-Liquori competed in the Junior Varsity History Bowl Nationals in Arlington, Virginia. The squad was missing two of their highest scorers. Momin Naveed, who qualified for Middle School History, Science, and Geography Nationals at the Syracuse Regional Bees in April, wasn't able to attend due to Ramadan. Peter Smith, the team's top scorer at Regionals (he finished second at the High School History Bee in Buffalo, qualifying for individual Nationals in the History Bee) was leading team scoring at SSNCT. Sophia, Gabriella, and Aidan defeated Florida during the preliminary rounds, but did not qualify for playoffs.

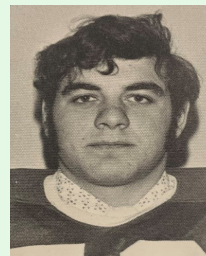

Born in 1965 to Linda Dyess and Leonard Baker, Marcel got his basketball career started at Danforth Elementary. After Danforth, he went to Roosevelt Junior High where he learned from legendary Roughrider Coach Bullock. This path prepared him for his stellar basketball career at Bishop Ludden playing for Hall of Fame coach Jerry Wilcox.

During his time at Ludden Marcel was a member of the 1981 Sectional Runner up, 1982 Sectional Champion, 1982 NYSPHSAA Regional Champion, 1982 NYSPHSAA Final Four team and 1983 CNYCL Champions.

His individual honors include Honorable Mention All CNYCL Sophomore year, Second Team All CNYCL Junior year, First Team All CNYCL Senior year, Selected as Captain of All CNYCL all-star team Senior year, All State 5th team selection Senior year and Bronze medal winner 1982 Summer Empire State Games.

Marcel one of the ultimate "team" players in Ludden history has always attributed any individual honors to his teammates and Coach Wilcox.

Marcel today is the owner of Your Way Landscaping also owner of Keeps It Simple network, Promoting and DJ for the Get Down Crew.

Leeann Duhoski

Class of 1986



While at Bishop Ludden, Leeann participated in Girls Varsity Basketball from 1982-86, Junior Varsity Girls Soccer from 1982-84, and Varsity Girls Soccer from 1984-86. She was named to the first-team Onondaga High School League Metro Division in Girls Basketball, was awarded the BLHS Principal's Trophy, and

was a member of the Empire State Games Central Region Girls Basketball Team.

Excelling academically, and in the top of her class, she was a member of the National Honor Society and participated in the Model United Nations. Her academic and athletic accomplishments were rewarded with an appointment to the United States Military Academy at West Point. Leeann earned a commission as a Second Lieutenant in the Army upon graduation in 1990, and went on to serve proudly in the Transportation Corps.

She separated from the Army after obtaining the rank of Captain. During her time at West Point, she was a four-year letter winner in Women's Basketball and was team co-captain her senior year. Army was the Empire State Conference Champion in 1987-88 and advanced to NCAA Division II Regionals (i.e. The Sweet Sixteen). Army ranked third in the nation in scoring defense, holding opponents to 57.5 ppg. Leeann was second in scoring (8.4 ppg.), first in rebounding with 171 caroms, and was named second-team Empire State Conference (ESC). In 1989-90, Army ranked first in the nation in scoring defense (49.3 ppg.), third in field goal percentage defense (35.0), and was runner-up in the ESC. Leeann was named honorable mention ESC and awarded the Outstanding Leadership Award for the 1989-90 Season. Currently, she ranks 24th in career points (928) and 11th in career rebounds (696) at West Point.

I entered Bishop Ludden in the fall of 1968. I was shy and scared. Fortunately, I met Coach Didio that summer and he told

me about football tryouts in late summer. That made the transition much easier. I made friends at practice, and we remained friends throughout high school. My football career only lasted two years, partially due to one of this year's inductees. I was a 145-pound freshman playing safety on the J.V. team. We were scrimmaging the Varsity and who breaks through the line with only me in his way of the goal line – none other than Dan Craver. When I awoke, I had a broken nose, sore ribs, and a bruised ego. No hard feelings Dan and thank you for reminding me of how much I love golf.

I played basketball for two years with moderate success. The only highlight was hitting a buzzer beater from the corner to beat the Brothers.

Our golf team was quite successful. I can't proceed without mentioning and thanking all the great teammates I had. Joe Haley, Tony Marino, Larry Smith, Danny Gwinn, Mark Farrell, John Esposito, Mike Thornton, John Cross, Jim Burke, Joan Corcoran, Bob Donavan, Marc Romanczyk and Dave Lizzi. Also coaches Father Parrent and Father Creed. If I omitted anyone, please forgive me. Thank you, no championships were possible without you.

We won the CNY Cities League in 1969 and 1972.

After graduation, I played professional golf with moderate success. I did make it twice to the PGA Tour School Finals. I qualified for and played in the Bank of Boston Classic in 1984, my only PGA Tour event.

Coach and Faculty, 1986-2021

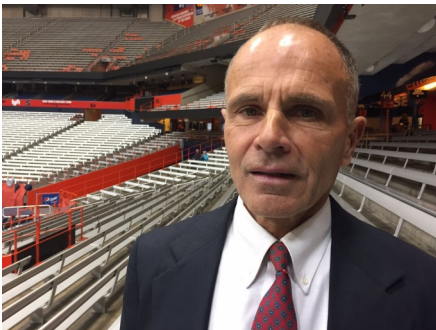

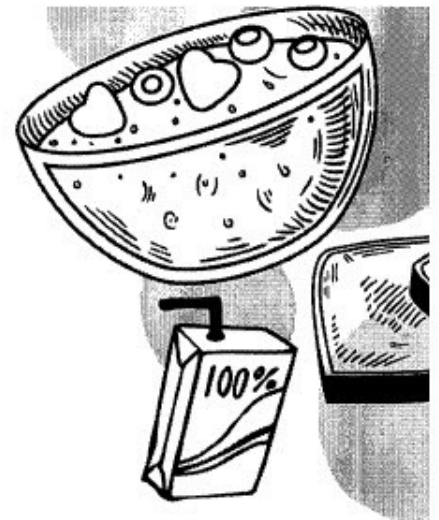


