From the Principal's Desk

Bishop Ludden Graduates first International Baccalaureate Class

The Bishop Ludden class of 2022 included the school's first International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Program (IBDP) graduates. Seven of the 37 graduating seniors met the requirements of the International Baccalaureate's Diploma Program, a two –year academically rigorous and comprehensive program designed to better prepare students for college. The Diploma Program "aims to encourage students to be knowledgeable, inquiring, caring and compassionate and to develop intercultural understanding, open mindedness and the attitudes necessary to respect and evaluate a range of viewpoints" (International Baccalaureate Diploma Program Subject Brief 2017). While several juniors and seniors are enrolled in IB courses (during the 2021-22 school year, 60 of 80 juniors/seniors were enrolled in at least one IB course), the Diploma Program (DP) requires students to meet specific course and program requirements as outlined below.

- Six (6) Internal and External Assessments covering both Standard Level (SL) and Higher Level (HL) courses. Internal assessments are assessments created by Bishop Ludden teachers who are trained IB teachers while External assessments are created by IB. Both sets of assessments are scored by IB staff in England. Standard Level courses are one year courses while Higher Level courses are two year courses.
- Creativity/Activity/Service (CAS). CAS is a comprehensive project that is organized around the three strands of Creativity: exploring or extending ideas that lead to an original product or performance, Activity: physical activity that promotes a healthy lifestyle or Service: engagement with the community in response to an authentic need. All Diploma Program candidates are required to complete a CAS project under the guidance of an IB trained Bishop Ludden teacher.
- Theory of Knowledge (TOK). TOK is a two year course that is central to the diploma program and focuses on metacognition or getting students to think about their thinking.
- Extended Essay. The extended essay involves independent research by students culminating with a 4,000 word essay.

In addition to the aforementioned requirements, DP candidates must also meet specific minimum grade requirements in their IB courses. Furthermore, while the awarding of college credit for IB coursework is up to individual colleges and universities, several of the recent graduates are reporting that their respective institutions are awarding between 12 and 42 college credits for their IB courses.

As we enter our third year as an International Baccalaureate school, Bishop Ludden continues to look to grow and develop our IB profile as one of only two high schools in Central New York that offers an International Baccalaureate experience.






