IB Info Line

Exciting progress is being made as Bishop Ludden prepares to become an IB World School!

The International Baccalaureate (IB) Programme started 50 years ago, to meet the needs of families all over the world whose children changed schools frequently. In its original form, IB enabled a student in an IB school in one country to seamlessly continue his/her education at an IB school in any OTHER country. The Programme offices are in Cardiff, Wales, and at first, participants were generally from families of international diplomats, professors, government officials, and corporate officers. But

the philosophy and very high quality of the IB Programme began to be noticed by families outside of those in international service. In the U.S., some states (like Florida) strongly backed the IB curriculum as a suggested statewide standard. Now, any student in Florida who earns the IB Diploma automatically is awarded free tuition to any unit in the Florida state university system.

The IB Programme offers three divisions, Primary Years, Middle Years, and the Diploma Programme (DP). Bishop Ludden is progressing in its candidate application to introduce the Diploma Programme, and may eventually consider offering the Middle Years Pro

gramme after the DP is up and running.

The IB DP mission is very similar to the stated mission of Bishop Ludden: we strive to provide the tools and environment so that our students can grow to their full potential academically, personally, and spiritually, thus becoming fulfilled and responsible stewards of the Earth and its global resources. The DP can be viewed as a structure, method, and environment by which our teachers/staff can think, act, and mentor in excellence, and lead our students to excellence.

Disclaimer: While we are excited to be on the road to becoming an IB World School, we are only in the process of having our candidacy approved. The above information is offered to advise readers in general about the structure and content of the IB Diploma Programme.

There is a suggested donation of \$5. to benefit the music program. Email Ms. Jamison at ajamison@syrdiocease.org with any questions.


