QUIZ BOWL

Final Results for the 2021 Ithaca Fall Invitational

Ithaca Fall Invitational Quiz Bowl Results.

The Ithaca Fall Invitational was a great success for the Bishop Ludden Quiz Bowl program. The team is completely rebuilding following the 2021 graduation of the entire A and B teams who captured the 2021 NY MasterMinds State title and finished seventh at Small School Nationals.

"We returned to live play for the first time in 19 months", explained Coach Maxine Babcock. "Our goal for this tournament was to get experience. Only a few players have had live play experience prior to Ithaca. We lost more than a full year of recruiting and had only remote tournaments in 2020-21."

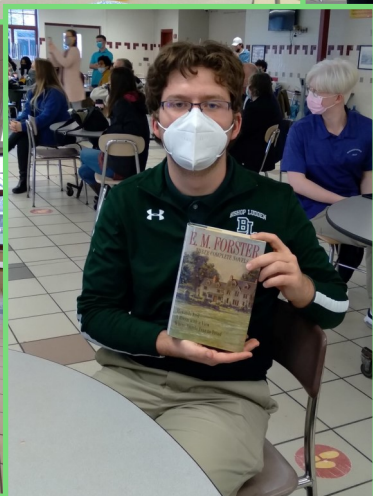
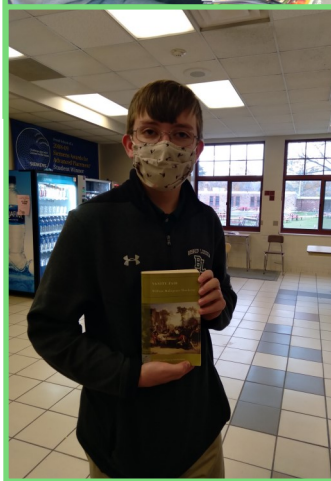
Bishop Ludden's Team D, starring sophomores Peter Smith, Zander Craner, and Julia Smith, along with seventh grader

Sophia Azria took seventh place with a final victory over Bishop Ludden A in the championship rounds. Peter took the third-place individual prize and finished second out of 65 players with 565 points. Peter was also the top scorer in the final round in the championship rounds. Zander logged 90 points, Sophia scored 20, and Julia added 10 overall. Zander hadn't played since 2019, while Sophia and Julia were playing for the first time ever.

The A Team of seniors ended up eighth in the championship rounds and featured senior captain Patrick McGinn Hammer taking the fifth-place individual prize. Pat scored 415 and John Michael Owens scored 25. Mark Collins notched 170 and Andrew Janowski added 80. An impressive feat since this was their first time playing the game. Both the B and C teams had victories. The B team starred juniors Ryan Brady, Isaiah Apps, Brigid Hardick, Jon

Daher, and Paul Owens. Ryan was the ninth leading scorer in the tournament with 255 points, Isaiah scored 70, Paul had 145, and Brigid scored 35. The eighth graders on the C Team improved all day with victories in both the qualifying rounds and consolation play and were ahead of top finishing teams in several matches. Momin Naveed finished 22 overall with 170 points, Olivia Smith scored 85, Payton Campbell had 65, and Gabriella Berry added 15.

Special thanks to parents John Craner, Daniel Smith, and Cheryl Hardick who helped drive and coach. The History Bowl in Buffalo was next, held on December 4. The junior high players have the online Ho Ho Ho tournament in Texas TQBA Houston Holiday Hoedown XIII) on December 11. The STEM Club focus shifts to Science Olympiad and Robotics for the winter season.

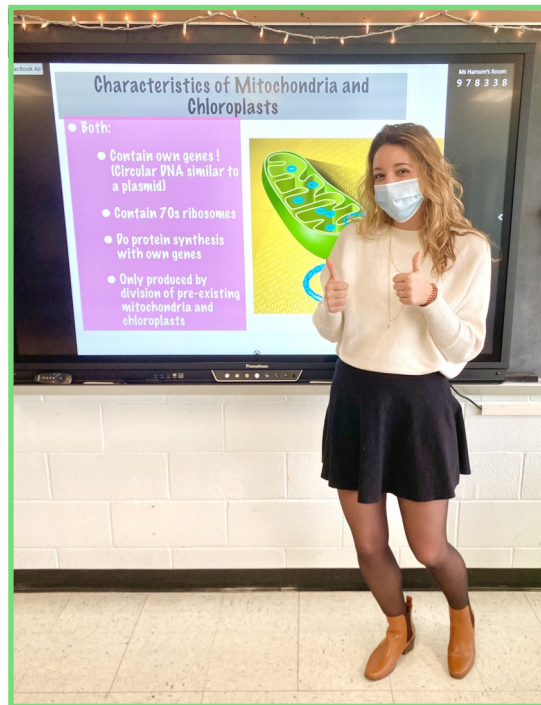

Ludden installs new Promethean boards

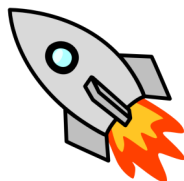

Meet Marjie Burkhart, parent of two Ludden alums

Marjie's daughter, Valerie, graduated from Bishop Ludden in 2017. Her son Kevin Burkhart graduated in 2019.

Why did you choose Bishop Ludden for your children?

We chose Bishop Ludden because after attending a school tour, it was the school that made the kids feel most comfortable. The academic program is strong, and the administration is committed to student guidance. There are plenty of extracurricular activities enabling them to participate in their current interests as well as gain access to new interests. I felt my children would be guided by adults that truly cared about their well-being as they prepared them for life after high school.

What's the best feedback you've received from you children about their time at Ludden?

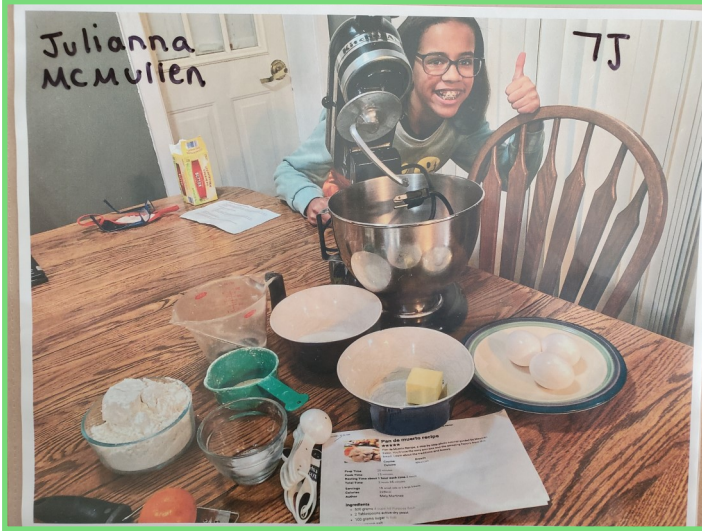
In what ways have you seen your kids grow personally and academically over their years here?

SCRIP PROGRAM: GIVE A GIFT CARD AND EARN MONEY TOWARD TUITION!



Do you shop at Target? Walmart? Amazon? JCPenney? Marshalls? Kohls? Barnes & Noble? Do you eat at Applebees? Olive Garden? Panera Bread? Cheesecake Factory? Subway? Dunkin’ Donuts? Are you planning a big home improvement project with Lowe’s or Home Depot? How about making vacation plans with Airbnb? American Airlines? Hilton Hotels? Carnival Cruise Lines? Disney?

SCRIP gives you the opportunity to earn credit towards your student’s tuition when you make your normal purchases from hundreds of retailers

So, how does it work?

Think of it as substitute money. When you purchase a SCRIP, you’re purchasing a normal gift card to use just like cash. But with every card you purchase, you’re earning money back towards the cost of tuition at Ludden. SCRIP cards can be used for groceries, clothing, gifts, gasoline, vacations and more! Extended family and friends can also order through your student, earning your family even more credit toward tuition!

How does buying a SCRIP generate revenue?

You order your SCRIP gift cards through the school and pay full face value for them. Bishop Ludden is able to buy SCRIP from hundreds of local and nationwide retailers through the Great Lakes Scrip Center at a discount. The discount, which varies from 1.5% to 25%, is returned to you as tuition credit for the following school year.

For example, if you purchase a \$50 gift card from a retailer that is offering a 10% discount, you have already saved \$5 on next year’s tuition bill.

If you’re planning a shopping trip to Target or a dinner at Cheesecake Factory, plan ahead and shop with SCRIP! Earn money back in the process — it really adds up. Families have earned hundreds of dollars towards their tuition bills.

How do I order SCRIP?

Download and complete an order form. There is a one time \$20 set-up fee paid annually, which covers shipping costs. Send the order to school with your student on the due date (always on a Monday) and the rest is up to our SCRIP coordinator. Your SCRIP order is returned to you or your student at school the Friday of the same week.

If you will not have a student enrolled at Bishop Ludden next year, the rebate amount will be donated to the Ludden Fund.

As the new Principal at Bishop Ludden Jr/Sr High School, I am writing to you regarding an important matter to not only the continued success of our school, but more importantly the growth and advancement of Bishop Ludden through your support of The Ludden Fund.

The support we receive through The Ludden Fund is essential to offset the true cost of educating a student at Bishop Ludden. You see tuition, while a significant driver of revenue, accounts for only about 60% of our school's operating budget. 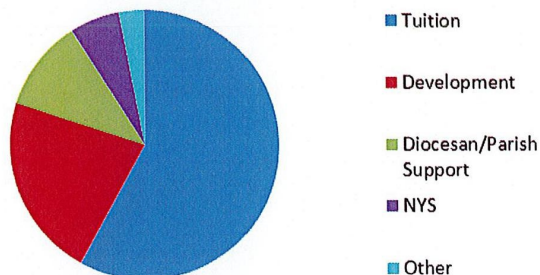

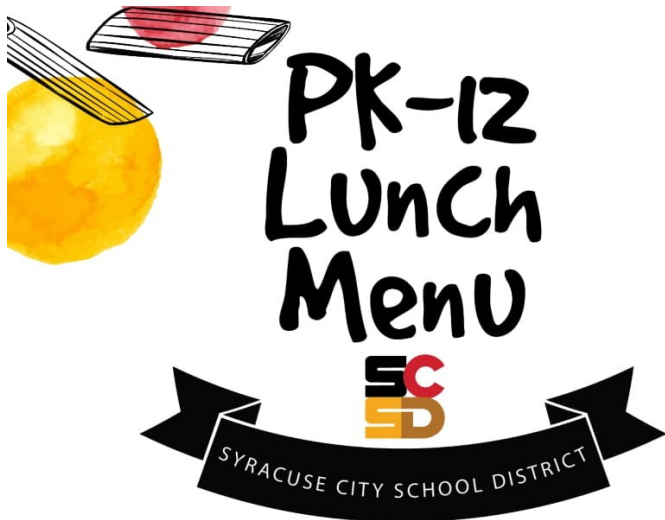
