## Bishop Ludden Middle School makes Quiz Bowl Winter Roundup Playoffs

Bishop Ludden's Middle School Quiz Bowl team has been on a positive trajectory all season. On Jan. 8, they played in the high school Yale Winter Invitational against some of the best high school teams in the country. Yale offered a free entry for the team and our BL middle school team got pounded 0-10 in games against teams like Phillips Academy (Exeter), Lexington, and Plano. The players got invaluable experience in preparation for their next event on Jan. 15's Texas Quiz Bowl Association's 2022 Winter Roundup Tournament, Lyft Division.

The team had a great opening game in the middle school Texas Quiz Bowl Tournament. In the 290-90 win over Beck B, Momin Naveed scored 120 points and Payton Campbell added 10. Anthony Taylor was the math king on computational math with 30 team points in the game. Basis McLean C swamped the team 400-45 in game 2. Bishop Ludden made a valiant attempt at a comeback against St John's B. Down 220-40 at the half, the team outscored St. John's 150-90 for the 310-190 loss. Momin and Payton each scored 30 in the loss and Olivia Smith added 10. "The team never gave up in that game and they took that second half momentum into the next three games," Coach Maxine Babcock said. "They went on to a three-game winning streak with games that came down to the final questions."

Game four was the team's most thrilling of the year. It went down to the wire against St.

## Holy Family alum makes Top 10 at Winter Roundup

Bishop Ludden's Momin Naveed finished the TBQA Winter Roundup, Lyft Division as the #8 overall player. Texas has many of the best Quiz Bowl programs in the country, so the eighth grader did a fantastic job in only his fifth month of play. Momin notched 355 individual points as he captained the team in the Texas online tournament. Momin's other tournament tallies this year have included 130 points at the Yale Winter Invitational against top caliber high school players, 170 points in the TBQA

Anne A. Bishop Ludden was behind 205-190 after question 19 out of 20. Anthony scored a power 15 on Question 20 to tie it; Payton clinched the thriller with the correct answer of "Abba" and ran the entire 30 bonus points for a 225-205 victory. Individual scores were 30 points for Momin, 10 for Olivia, 15 for Anthony, and 45 for Payton. Momin went on a three-question run to hold off Basis McLean B 265-195 in game 5. Olivia had a personal season high score of 25. Seventh-grader Sophia Azria powered in 15, while Payton added 10. Momin had 65. The team needed a victory against undefeated Washington International to make the playoffs. BL took the lead on question 10 and WI stayed tight until Meghan Snyder scored on question 17. Momin secured the win on question 19 for a 210-150 victory. Momin had 60 this game, Payton had 25. Bishop Ludden was taken out by Clark 465-135 in round nine of the single elimination playoffs. Clark took a six-question run to start the game to log an insurmountable 200-point lead. Bishop Ludden never quit and hung in to score 135 points in the 465-135 loss. Payton led the team with 30, Momin added 25, Anthony powered for 15 and Olivia added 5. The team finished in 11th place overall.

Every player scored in terms of individual points. Quiz Bowl has 20 tossup questions. Teams of four each buzz-in to try to individually answer the questions. Players who answer early (the power mark) gain 15 points. Correct answers after the power mark add 10 points. The first incorrect buzz-in before the end of the question causes negative five points. There is no penalty after the question ends. The correct team has a chance at three 10-point questions after each individual tossup. Players do not get individual credit for bonuses and they collaborate to answer each section. Strong players may never log individual points.

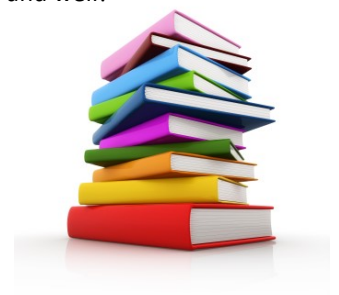

## Bishop Ludden Athletics *Philosophy*

The basic educational philosophy of Bishop Ludden High School is to facilitate religious, academic, cultural, and social development. We believe that a comprehensive program of student activities is vital to the educational development of our students. The athletic program is a complete extension of this philosophy.

The purpose of the athletic program is to promote the ideals of competition, teamwork and sportsmanship while achieving the goals of success and participation in a safe and positive environment. The athletic program will help support the physical, social, and psychological development of our student athletes, as well as develop a sense of self-confidence, self-discipline, organization, decision-making skills, and goal orientation. Our program will help in the development of self-worth and a healthy self-concept regardless of the student athlete's role or play on the team.

The final role of our athletic program is to have these student-athletes carry all these values and life lessons throughout their life.

Think of it as substitute money. When you purchase a SCRIP, you’re purchasing a normal gift card to use just like cash. But with every card you purchase, you’re earning money back towards the cost of tuition at Ludden. SCRIP cards can be used for groceries, clothing, gifts, gasoline, vacations and more! Extended family and friends can also order through your student, earning your family even more credit toward tuition!

### How does buying a SCRIP generate revenue?

You order your SCRIP gift cards through the school and pay full face value for them. Bishop Ludden is able to buy SCRIP from hundreds of local and nationwide retailers through the Great Lakes Scrip Center at a discount. The discount, which varies from 1.5% to 25%, is returned to you as tuition credit for the following school year.

For example, if you purchase a \$50 gift card from a retailer that is offering a 10% discount, you have already saved \$5 on next year’s tuition bill.

If you’re planning a shopping trip to Target or a dinner at Cheesecake Factory, plan ahead and shop with SCRIP! Earn money back in the process — it really adds up. Families have earned hundreds of dollars towards their tuition bills.

### How do I order SCRIP?

Download and complete an order form. There is a one time \$20 set-up fee paid annually, which covers shipping costs. Send the order to school with your student on the due date (always on a Monday) and the rest is up to our SCRIP coordinator. Your SCRIP order is returned to you or your student at school the Friday of the same week.

If you will not have a student enrolled at Bishop Ludden next year, the rebate amount will be donated to the Ludden Fund.

My husband and I have moved 19 times, and had addresses in seven different states (most of the moves were related to his job), but because of our experience of having attended Catholic grammar schools, Catholic high schools, and Catholic college (we met at Niagara University), we knew we'd enroll our kids in Catholic schools as well. As a graduate of a Catholic high school, I was incredibly well-prepared for the academic rigor of college courses, and I saw the same hold true for our four kids as they all went on to college (and are now grads and gainfully employed in the real world).


I'd encourage all parents to take advantage of the educational opportunity that Bishop Ludden provides, because I KNOW that it will prove itself to be valuable throughout their children's lives. The values of the parents will be upheld and supported by Ludden; the academics will prepare them well for college and beyond; the theology classes will stay with them forever; and they will treasure the friends they make and the teachers who care about them. All of this will be true, even if the kids don't recognize it until years later.

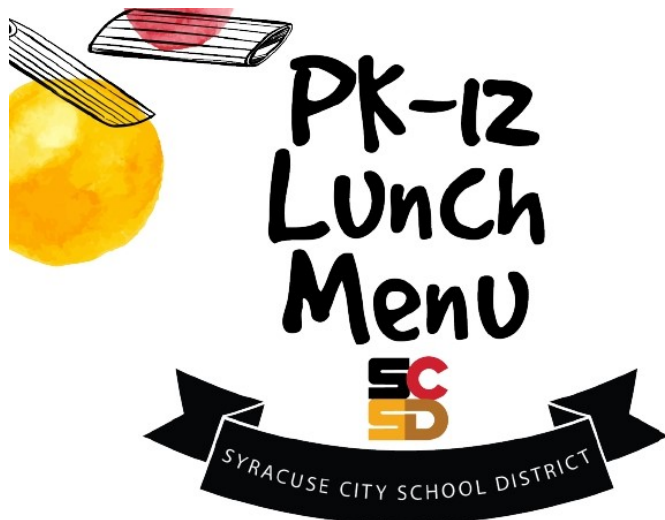
