ADVENTURES IN THE AMAZON DR CHARLES A MANGO

Our upper-level science classes attended a guest lecture for student appreciation day hosted by Dr. Charles A. Mango, father of three Bishop Ludden alums and local ophthalmology specialist. Dr. Mango has dedicated his life to studying the flora and fauna of the Amazon rainforest with over 28 trips to his base camp and two-and-a-half years entirely spent in the jungle.

Dr. Mango's talk was one of expertise and intrigue, as he led us through the history of the Peruvian Amazon and the environmental science of what makes a rainforest: rain and trees! However, unlike the average CNY Maple, the trees of a rainforest are defined by the buttresses that support their immense weight and the large leaves that soak up what little light enters the canopy. Trees that large take 500 years to replace, making deforestation a serious issue.



Not everything was so dire as Dr. Mango's wit led to more than a few giggles, especially his story of his housemate in the ecolodge where he stayed: Simba the ocelot. Simba could be as tame as a housecat, sitting on Dr. Mango's lap and sucking his thumb, but his stealing of chickens reminded everyone that he was still a wild animal.



Dr. Mango concluded his talk by sharing his animal photography--ranging from him holding a boa constrictor to the tiniest monkey. Sometimes terrifying, like learning that tarantulas can swim, sometimes awe-inspiring, like the pink bottle-nosed dolphins who have been around since Pangea, the Amazon is certainly an amazing and mysterious place.

On behalf of the entire Bishop Ludden community, we would like to thank Dr. Mango for inspiring our students to seek out scientific adventures.

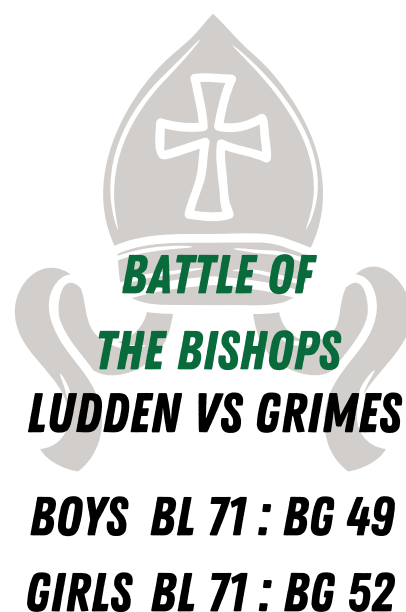

Thank you to our alumni and friends who have given so generously during this 23/24 school year. Our year runs from July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024, so **there is plenty of time to contribute for this school year!**

Bishop Ludden 's students, families, faculty, and staff are very grateful for the generosity of our alumni, faculty, Board members, coaches, parents, grandparents, and friends. We need the support of all of you.

The annual campaign helps to keep our tuition as affordable as it can be for our families. It also can provide hardship tuition assistance for some families.

The comprehensive campaign will raise \$2 million for its two main pillars: \$1 million for scholarships/financial assistance and \$1 million for our International Baccalaureate Program which requires upgrades to our technology, Library facilities and Science facilities.
