

# IB Diploma Program

## International Baccalaureate

Dear BLG Community,

We would like to hear from you regarding the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IB DP) at Bishop Ludden-Grimes Jr Sr High School (BLG)

High school academic programs are routinely subject to external accreditation review. IB DP is scheduled for review in 2026. The review is an opportunity to help IB DP grow and flourish for the benefit of BLG students. A site visit from the IB accreditation team will happen next fall.

The IB DP is guided by a steering committee. In step with IB expectations, steering committee membership includes BLG faculty, BLG administration, a current IB DP student, an IB DP parent, and the IB DP Coordinator. In preparation for the IB site visit, the steering committee has designed a brief survey to inform a self-study report. The survey will require less than 15 minutes of your time.


# NovemBEAR





