
In The Classroom...

IB score results from coursework and multiple exams	AP score results from single exam
IB exams are mostly written	AP exams are mostly multiple choice
IB is globally recognized	AP is more common in the U.S.
IB builds research, writing, and critical thinking skills	AP builds subject knowledge and test skills






Spooky Story Contest

James Dietrich

Bishop Ludden Class of 1988



Catholic Law alumnus James Dietrich '95 has been appointed to the Montgomery County Circuit Court by Maryland Governor Wes Moore. In announcing the judicial appointment, Governor Moore praised Dietrich as a "remarkable servant of the law," citing his more than two decades of service as a prosecutor and his unwavering commitment to integrity and justice. The Governor emphasized the positive impact Dietrich will have on the people of Maryland and expressed gratitude for his willingness to serve on the bench.

James Dietrich has worked as a prosecutor with the Montgomery County State's Attorney's Office for the past seven years, managing some of the most difficult cases as a member of the major crimes and post convictions units. He also serves as an adjunct professor at the Catholic University of America, Columbus School of Law, where he teaches courses on evidence, criminal procedure, and trial practice. Dietrich began his career as a prosecutor with the Howard County State's Attorney's Office, where he served as assistant state's attorney for 21 years and served as the circuit court trial team leader for over ten years.

Jeanne Doyle passed away surrounded by people who loved her on Friday, October 10th, a blue-skied, red-leaved, crispy fall day, the kind that beckoned Jeanne back to Auburn after several decades in Florida.

After graduating from Bishop Ludden High School, she traveled to Alaska where she played volleyball under the midnight sun and took guitar lessons before moving to Florida where she lived for 40 years, raising her three children and teaching preschool.

Forever moved by the tide of her own soul, Jeanne relocated back to her hometown of Auburn in 2023, where she loved to attend any of her brother Mark's concerts, eat gyros from her brother Michael's food trucks, go for walks with her sister, Susi, and spend time with her companion, Teddy Prystal.

Jeanne was the tenth child of Jean and Bob Doyle. She was the little sister to Mark, Lisa, Chunky, Lori, Beth, Gretchen, Susi, Willy, and Brendan, the big sister to Michael, Tara, and Amy, but the favorite of all. Jeanne was, and will forever be, the mother to her sons Garrett and Jesse, and to her daughter Lauren, whose loving care in the last two months of Jeanne's life allowed her soul to transition peacefully.

Bill Thater, Bishop Grimes



William Edward "Bill" Thater, 76, of Marietta, passed peacefully in his sleep on Tuesday, October 7, 2025, at Iroquois Nursing Home.

He attended Holy Trinity Elementary School, graduated from Bishop Grimes High School, and attended Onondaga Community College before becoming a pioneer in technology. A job working on early computers ignited a lifelong passion for programming and for the construction and administration of databases that Bill turned into a career in the then-emerging field of microcomputing. He co-authored a book and spoke at conferences in the US and Scotland.

Bill is remembered for always having a story or anecdote for every situation. He enjoyed having long conversations, alternating between debating esoteric details about nearly any topic and laughing at his own jokes. He would spend many hours playing cards and board games with family and also enjoyed reading and watching science fiction; traits he passed on to the next generation.

Bill is survived by his wife, Sharon Thater and son, Michael; previous wife, Agnes Thater; his children Edward (Laura), Kristen, Allison, and Joseph; and a grandson, Thomas Patrick Thater. He was predeceased by his parents.
