Dear Bishop Ludden Community,



As I write these words, it is gently snowing and I am
feeling excitement for what our season will bring us

House Points

Have you heard about Hogwarts School? If you have, then you probably know about the Harry Potter books and movies. Bishop Ludden is adopting one of Hogwarts School traditions (not spells or wizardry, of course), but instead the House system points. As you know, all students are split into different houses by grade level. Each house will be competing against one another for a quarterly prize. There will be a junior high winner and a senior high house winner for EACH quarter. Plus, at the end of the school year, there will be a grand prize winner for the most points accumulated from all four quarters combined. The point charts will be displayed on the bulletin boards outside of the cafeteria. Winners of each quarter will receive a prize; such as a pizza party, dress down day or ice cream social party. Again, only the junior high and senior high house with the most points will win the prize, NOT the entire grade level.

So, how do students receive points for their house? There are three different ways:

- 1.) Campus Ministry Peer Leaders and a volunteer senior student will be conducting different activities once a month in the houses. For instance, just this past week, the Peer Leaders did an icebreaker game with each house called "The Human Knot." The class that had the fastest time received the most points.
- 2.) Surprise Dress Code Inspection. Peer Leaders will be coming into the houses and checking if the students are in proper dress code. (see page 3-4 of the Student Handbook – green calendar – for guidelines on dress code)
- 3.) Students can attend certain school activities. Students, parents and faculty will be given a list of what activities will count towards points at the beginning of each quarter. The day after the activity, Peer Leaders will go into the houses to tally how many students from each house attended the event.

Points are given on percentage. For example, if 70% of the house is in proper dress code or attend one of the activities, the house receives 7 points, 80% = 8 points, 90% = 9 points, but if 100% are in proper dress code or attend one of the designated activities, not only does the house receive 10 points, but they will receive an additional 10 bonus points.

So, what's the point of this House System friendly competition? Not just to receive a pizza party, but more importantly, to create relationships and build bonds between fellow classmates.

Practice, practice, practice.

If one of the keys to success in education is practice, then an important question becomes, "What tools are available to students to facilitate practice?"

If you are a student in Dr. Ostrander's classes, there are many such tools available on the web. Two of the newest additions are the "Parts of a Microscope Worksheet" (see <http://www.nyostrander.us/Science7/Assignments/MicroscopePartsWS.pdf>) and the "Parts of a Microscope Worksheet Key" (see <http://www.nyostrander.us/Science7/AnswerKeys/MicroscopePartsKey.html>).

The fun part is the answer key web page. It comes complete with card flips which allow students to practice by hovering the cursor over the cards which automatically flip over to reveal the name of the microscope part and then flip back to a letter that identifies that part on the image of the microscope. This allows for repeated practice until mastery is achieved.

So, have fun learning on Doc O's whacky world where you can click it and learn it.

"In the Lexus Eco Challenge, student teams tackle environmental issues related to land, water, air, and climate, and create practical solutions while competing for amazing prizes—for eligible teachers, students, and schools, \$500,000 in scholarships and grants awaits. The contest is broken into three main parts. The Land & Water Challenge is first, followed by an Air & Climate Challenge. The Final Challenge is by invitation only, open to winners of the previous two challenges. The Lexus Eco Challenge gets students involved in project-based learning, teamwork, and skill building as they identify an environmental issue that affects their community, use their critical-thinking and research skills to come up with a solution, and report on the results by way of an Action Plan. Teams of five to ten students look to the Challenge Planner for time-management guidance, and are led by one or two Teacher Advisors—who are full-time teachers employed at the school (not volunteers or parents)—to help their community while getting a chance to compete for scholarships and grants."
